

## **A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE SOCIETY'S BURIAL SITES**

During the summer of 1857, under tragic circumstances, the St. Andrew's Society of Montreal acquired its first burial lot in the Mount Royal Cemetery. It was generously donated by the Mount Royal Cemetery Company at the time of the S.S. "Montreal" shipping disaster which occurred on the St. Lawrence River between Quebec City and Montreal on the afternoon of June 26<sup>th</sup>, 1857.

Of the 450 passengers on board (320 of whom were newly-arrived Scottish immigrants) over 250 perished, either by fire or drowning. Fifteen of the victims and seventy-six of the survivors who arrived on the rescue ship at the Port of Montreal on June 27<sup>th</sup> were Scottish. These survivors were taken to the recently opened St. Andrew's Home on St. George Street, where they were welcomed and remained in the Society's care until they were able to travel onwards to their original destinations or, in some cases, return by ship to their families in Scotland. The Society also carried out the necessary arrangements for the welfare of the orphaned children, expressing the wish that, if possible, they should not be separated when placed in the orphanage.

On the afternoon of July 2<sup>nd</sup>, following a religious service conducted by one of the Society's chaplains, the Rev. Dr. Taylor, the fifteen Scottish victims (two mothers, twelve young children and one young lad) were laid to rest, side by side, at the carefully-chosen burial site in Mount Royal Cemetery. With the exception of a 9-month old baby boy, John Muir, the names of the other victims remain unknown. The baby's mother, Agnes Muir, would appear to have been at the grave-side along with some of the survivors, officers of the Society and others. A few days earlier, she and a number of other survivors, accompanied by some of the Society's officers had travelled by train to Quebec City for the sad task of identifying the victims. Mrs. Muir identified the bodies of her husband, James Muir and their 7-year old son, James, but the name of their missing 4-year old daughter, Violet was not mentioned on the list of the bodies found at that particular time. The newly widowed mother and her only remaining child, 9-year old George, remained at the St. Andrew's Home until they left on July 9<sup>th</sup>, bound for Detroit. Substantial donations and assistance were received from not only Scots and others in the community but also from Scottish Societies and donors across the country as well as the U.S.A. This enabled all the survivors, including Agnes Muir and her son, to be completely outfitted, provided with luggage, extra clothing, necessities, free transportation and appropriate funds prior to their departure. Sadly, within that same month, one of the orphaned survivors, a baby girl of 18 months, Jennie Caldwell, died in hospital and was laid to rest in the Society's lot beside the other fifteen victims, in the presence of the Society's President, William Murray.

After a period of ten years and many other burials, an additional lot was required and the one adjacent to the original lot was graciously granted by the M.R.C.C.'s Board of Trustees. The deed for both lots (Section F 28) was presented to the Society in 1869, the year in which eleven

persons had been buried, one of whom was Sir Walter Scott's nephew, William Scott, who had been a patient for over two years in the St. Andrew's Home, where he died in April of that year.

In fulfilling its benevolent endeavours, the Society, since 1857, has ensured the provision of burial space for many Scots and their descendants; especially during the earlier years in times of many epidemics and calamities. Throughout these years, the Charitable Committee members were most vigilant in following the ruling that: *"It is the Society's express injunction that none of our countrymen or countrywomen, dying helpless and friendless in this City, are to be buried at the public's expense"*. They were so alert that on one occasion, after seeing a newspaper item regarding the sudden deaths of three Scotsmen, they apparently rushed to the morgue and claimed the bodies for burial in the Society's lot.

By the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, the first of four other grave sites was purchased, two at the Hawthorn- Dale Cemetery (Lot 21, No. 31 & Lot 48, No. 59 ) in 1912 and 1923 and two in the newer section at the Mount Royal Cemetery (Section G 762 & 762A) in 1913 and 1940.

In the Society's 75<sup>th</sup> annual report (1909 / 1910) it is recorded that 155 burials in the Society's lots had taken place in the 75-year period. The amount of burials shown in the recently compiled listing from 1857 to 1985, the Society's 150<sup>th</sup> year, is now 322. This does not, however, include the fourteen unnamed S.S. "Montreal" victims. The names listed are mainly taken from the M.R.C.C.'s records with some from the Society's records. With only a few exceptions, e.g., persons who had died in the St. Andrew's Home, the Society has not mentioned the names of the deceased in the annual reports - only the number of burials in each year. In the majority of cases, the burials have been in the Society's lots but there have been occasions where the interments have been in other lots, such as family ones for example. With some exceptions, the burial and funeral expenses were arranged and funded by the Society. On a number of occasions, donations were later received in grateful appreciation from family members, especially those in Scotland.

On October 17<sup>th</sup>, 1953 a memorial stone was unveiled at the Society's lot in Section G 762 & 762A and a dedication prayer was offered by Col., The Rev. George Kilpatrick.

Almost thirty years later, in November, 1982 and to the sound of the pipes, a monument in memory of the victims of the S.S. "Montreal" disaster was unveiled by the Rt. Hon., The Earl of Mansfield, accompanied by the Society's President, Judge George Gould.

**From the St. Andrew's Day Sermon, 1869 - by the Rev. Alex. Young, Knox Church:**

*"And for those of our friendless countrymen whom death overtook far from their native land, a decent interment has been provided. Like a kind and tender mother putting her children to rest, the St. Andrew's Society has sought to soothe their last hours, and when death closed the scene, she gave them a coffin and a grave in a strange land."*

The foregoing list of 322 names is mainly based on the records of the Mount Royal and the Hawthorn-Dale Cemeteries. It has been cross-referenced with various records of the St Andrew's Society of Montreal, including those wherein only the number of burials but not the names of the deceased are mentioned. Consequently, during a number of years in the nineteenth-century, particularly between 1878-1886, it has been difficult to reconcile the MRCC records with those of the Society. The research in this regard is ongoing, but it is presently estimated that the Society buried 366 people during the last 128 years.

The first sixteen people buried by the Society in Section F 28 were all victims of the SS Montreal disaster which took place during 1857. Only two of these people are identified by name.
